## Overview of Humanitarian Funding

**What Table 1 tells us** → FTS processed **\$12.91 billion** humanitarian funding as of 30 June 2024. This includes funding towards coordinated plans (**\$9.34 billion**) and funding falling outside the coordinated efforts (**\$3.57 billion**). GHO coverage for 2024 funding stands at **19.13 per cent** with GHO requirements in amount of **\$48.71 billion**.

**What Table 2 tells us** → ‘Food security’ has received almost one fourth of the total humanitarian funding in 2024. This is followed by “health” with **11.46 per cent** of the total humanitarian funding. Multi-sector for refugees ranks the third as was the case in 2023. GBV funding increased by **\$60.41 million** from 2022 to 2023 but dropped one place in the overall ranking from 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup>. GBV funding stands in the 14<sup>th</sup> place as of 30 June 2024 with **\$221.17 million** - a mere **1.71 per cent** of the total humanitarian funding. In general, 2024 GBV funding appears promising when compared to previous years.

**What Table 3 tells us** → Consistent with the last two years, ROMENA ranks first with **26.51 per cent (\$3.41 billion)** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024 as of 30 June 2024- driven mainly by OPT with **9.58 per cent** of total humanitarian funding and ranking the first among all countries (**\$1.23 billion**), by the Syrian Arab Republic capturing **6.23 per cent** of total humanitarian funding (**\$803.21 million**) and by Yemen with **\$640.63 million** funding (**4.97 per cent**).

**What Table 4 tells us** → Humanitarian operations in OPT are the most funded in 2024 with **\$1.69 billion** as of 30 June 2024. Ukraine, the most funded country in 2022 and 2023, places third in 2024. The Syrian Arab Republic and Afghanistan rank fourth and fifth respectively in 2024.

**What Table 5 tells us** → Across the last three years, USA has been the top donor and provides **30.46 per cent** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024. Germany dropped from the second place -both in 2022 and 2023- to fourth in 2024. ECHO ranked third in 2022 and 2023 and rose to the second place in 2024. Japan, ranked fourth both in 2022 and 2023, stands at the third place in 2024. The top five donors provided **63.18 per cent** of total humanitarian funding for the 01 January 2024 – 30 June 2024 period.

**What Table 6 tells us** → WFP has remained the most funded organization in 2022, 2023 and 2024 receiving almost one fourth of the reported total humanitarian funding in 2024. For the last three years, UNICEF and UNHCR have occupied the second and third places. ICRC, ranked fifth in 2022, has risen to fourth place in 2024. Overall, the top five recipients have received **45.18 per cent** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024.

**What Table 7 tells us** → National and local organizations have received **2.15 per cent (\$276.74 million)** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024. This is far from meeting the 25 per cent commitment set out by Grand Bargain. The UN Agencies, Funds and Programmes are the most funded with **55.60 per cent** of the total humanitarian funds in 2024.

**What Table 8 tells us** → **72 per cent** of the 2024 total humanitarian funding went towards **40** coordinated plans consisting of **24** HRPs, **5** FAs, **9** RRP and **2** other types of plans.

**What Table 10 tells us** → 2024 GHO coverage stands at **19.13 per cent** with **\$48.71 billion** requirements. 2024 GHO funding stands at **\$9.34 billion**, **\$6.84 billion** of which are HRPs, **\$1.11 billion** RRP, **\$1.36 billion** FAs and **\$12.32 million** other types of plans.
