

This FTS-produced update presents funding information reported to and processed by FTS from 1<sup>st</sup> of January to 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2024. ## Total Humanitarian Funding

1. From 1 January to 31 January 2024, FTS processed **\$3.51 billion** in support of humanitarian action across **123** countries. This includes funding towards coordinated humanitarian efforts (**\$701.46 million**) and funding outside such efforts (**\$2.81 billion**). The 2024 total is a **\$1.03 billion** decrease when compared to **\$4.54 billion** reached by 31 January 2023. In addition to 2023 monies, FTS has received and processed multiyear monies in the amount of **\$821.69 million** for 2025 and **\$266.23 million** for 2026.
2. The top 5 donors have contributed **\$2.54 billion (72.50 per cent)** of the total humanitarian funding processed in 2024. The United States of America (USA) is the top donor followed by EU/ECHO, Germany, Switzerland and the Netherlands. At this time in 2023, FTS processed **\$4.01 billion** donated by top 5 donors (**88.34 per cent**).
3. Asia and the Pacific (AP) shows an increase in funds from **\$280.02 million** in 2023 to **\$467.77 million** in 2024. All other regions record a decline: Monies towards the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) decreased from **\$1.01 billion** in 2023 to **\$644.34 million** in 2024. Southern and Eastern Africa (SEA) went down from **\$1.23 billion** in 2023 to **\$521.70 million** in 2024, Europe from **\$566.39 million** in 2023 to **\$402.47 million** in 2024 and West & Central Africa (WCA) from **\$813.20 million** in 2023 to **\$615.63 million** in 2024.
4. In the context of sectoral granularity (**\$2.09 billion** in 2024), the share of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) funding has increased: **\$10.49 million** in 2022 to **\$19.35 million** in 2023 to **\$94.20 million** in 2024.
5. Private sector contributions stand at **\$24.50 million (0.70 per cent)** of the total 2024 monies) compared to **\$48.88 million** in 2023 (**1.08 per cent**) and **\$4.63 million** in 2022 (**0.19 per cent**).
6. Total cash modality usage has increased from **\$661.8 million** in 2022 to **\$693.3 million** in 2023 and decreased to **\$199.6 million** in 2024. Likewise, multisector cash usage standing at **\$334.0 million** in 2022 went up to **\$524.1 million** in 2023 and decreased to **\$132.0 million** in 2024.

## Total Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO) Funding

7. Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO) requirements have risen from **\$41.04 billion** in 2022 to **\$51.64 billion** in 2023 and decreased to **\$46.55 billion** in 2024. The GHO coverage stands at **1.51 per cent** at the end of January 2024, up from the **0.17 per cent** recorded at the same time of 2023. The number of coordinated plans was **37** in 2022, **38** in 2023 and **36** in 2024: **25** Humanitarian Response Plans (HRPs), **2** Flash Appeals (FAs) and **9** Refugee Response Plans (RRPs).

8. As of 31 January 2024, there are **44** donors allocated and reported funding in comparison to **8** in 2023 and **12** in 2022. Likewise, the number of recipients received and reported funding in 2024 is **92**, up from **24** in 2023 and from **33** in 2022.

9. EU/ECHO, the top humanitarian donor, contributed **28.84 per cent** of the total GHO funding in 2024 (**\$202.30 million**) – **\$199.4 million (25.46 per cent)** more than last year. The USA, the second with **21.35 per cent (\$149.79 million)** in 2024 was not within the list of donors for the first month of 2023. Likewise, Germany, a distant third with **14.24 per cent (\$99.87 million)** was not listed as donor for the first month of 2023. Switzerland held the fourth position with **5.81 per cent (\$40.75 million)** in 2024 - **\$40.21 million (5.18 per cent)** more than last year. Italy ranked fifth in 2024 with **3.19 per cent (\$22.39 million)**, which was not listed among donors for the first month of 2023.

10. International Non-Governmental Organizations (INGOs) are the most funded in 2024 with **44.50 per cent** of all GHO funding received. The share received by UN Agencies, Funds and Programmes (UNAFPs) stands at **41.43 per cent**. International Society & Red Cross/Red Crescent Movement received **0.24 per cent** of total GHO funds. The share of local and national organizations (as per the Grand Bargain definition) stands at **0.49 per cent** at the end of January 2024.
