

This FTS-produced report presents funding information reported to and processed by FTS from 01 January to 31 March 2024. It includes comparisons across the past 3 years. Total Humanitarian Funding- in and out Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO)

1. From 1 January to 31 March 2024, FTS processed **\$5.90 billion** humanitarian funding. This includes funding towards coordinated plans (**\$3.00 billion**) and funding falling outside the coordinated efforts (**\$2.89 billion**). The 2024 total is a **\$3.06 billion** decrease when compared to **\$8.96 billion** reached by 31 March 2023. In addition to 2024 monies, FTS has received and processed multiyear monies in the amount of **\$1.24 billion** for 2025 and **\$361.05 million** for 2026. (Note: The decrease is due to staff annual and sick leave and the timing of UN national holidays. A backlog accumulated which the FTS began clearing in April 2024. No inference is therefore being made in terms of funding numbers).
2. All regions record a decline in 2024 when compared to same time last year: Funding towards the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) decreased from **\$2.03 billion** in 2023 to **\$1.22 billion** in 2024. Similarly, the Southern and Eastern Africa (SEA) went down from **\$2.10 billion** in 2023 to **\$1.05 billion** in 2024; Asia and the Pacific (AP) from **\$867.66 million** in 2023 to **\$606.24 million** in 2024, Europe from **\$916.88 million** in 2023 to **\$505.25 million** in 2024, Latin America & the Caribbean (LAC) from **\$298.07 million** in 2023 to **\$155.69 million** in 2024 and finally the West & Central Africa (WCA) from **\$1.08 billion** in 2023 to **\$785.18 million** in 2024.
3. In the context of sectoral granularity in 2024 (**\$3.61 billion**), food security is the most funded with **\$986.75 million**. The share of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) funding has increased over a three-year period: from **\$28.35 million** in 2022 to **\$43.02 million** in 2023 and to **\$117.75 million** in 2024.
4. The top five donors have contributed **\$3.49 billion (59.29 per cent)** of the total humanitarian funding processed in 2024. USA is the top donor followed by Germany, EU/ECHO, Japan and Switzerland respectively in 2024. At this time in 2023, FTS processed **\$6.92 billion** donated by the top five donors (**77.24 per cent**).
5. Humanitarian donations by private sector in 2024 stand at **\$64.38 million (1.09 per cent)** of the total funding) as compared to **\$176.17 million** in 2023 (**1.97 per cent**) and **\$261.21 million** in 2022 (**4.72 per cent**).
6. WFP remains the top recipient of humanitarian funds in 2022, 2023 and 2024. However, its share is on a downward trend: **25.14 per cent** in 2022 vs. **23.41 per cent** in 2023 vs. **15.39 per cent** in 2024. The other top five recipients of funds include three UN entities: CERF second, UNICEF, fourth, and IOM fifth (the ICRC third).
7. Percentage wise, the share of humanitarian funding towards national and local organizations has increased from **\$17.80 million** in 2022 (**0.32 per cent**) to **\$78.65 million** in 2023 (**0.88 per cent**) to **\$75.21 million** in 2024 (**1.27 per cent**).

Total GHO Funding

8. Global Humanitarian Overview (GHO) requirements rose from **\$43.22 billion** in 2022 to **\$54.19 billion** in 2023 and decreased to **\$46.09 billion** in 2024. The GHO coverage stands at **6.53 per cent** at the end of March 2024, down from the **9.94 per cent** recorded at the same time of 2023. The number of coordinated plans was **40** in 2022, **41** in 2023 and **36** in 2024. The 2024 GHO consists of **24** Humanitarian Response Plans (HRPs), **3** Flash Appeals (FAs) and **9** Refugee Response Plans (RRPs).
9. Food security is the most funded sector in 2024 with **\$830.26 million** funding, as was the case for the same time in 2023 with **\$1.95 billion** funding. The share of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) funding has increased in a three-year period from **\$11.80 million** in 2022 to **\$30.11 million** in 2023 to **\$59.56 million** in 2024.
10. Multi-purpose cash assistance rose from **\$365.3 million (16.02 per cent)** in 2022 to **\$615.3 million (11.43 per cent)** in 2023 for the January- March period but has decreased to **\$192.4 million (6.41 per cent)** in 2024.
11. USA, the top humanitarian donor, contributed **29.41 per cent** of the total GHO funding in 2024 (**\$884.86 million**) – **\$2.03 billion** less than in 2023. ECHO, ranking second with **12.42 per cent (\$373.80 million)** in 2024 ranked the third in 2023 with **\$449.30 million (8.34 per cent)**. Germany, ranking third with **10.25 per cent (\$308.28 million)** in 2024 was the second top donor in 2023. Switzerland holding the fourth position with **5.51 per cent (\$165.69 million)** in 2024, ranked thirteenth in 2023 with **0.71 per cent (\$38.37 million)**. The Japan has dropped from fourth in 2023 with **6.53 per cent (\$351.95 million)** to the fifth in 2024 with **5.48 per cent (\$165.02 million)**.
12. Humanitarian donations by private sector stand at **\$57.70 million (1.92 per cent)** as compared to **\$110.65 million** in 2023 (**2.05 per cent**) and **\$76.55 million** in 2022 (**3.34 per cent**).
13. WFP remains the most funded humanitarian actor across 2022, 2023 and 2024. The top five recipients of 2024 are all UN agencies: IOM the second, UNICEF the third, FAO the fourth and UNRWA the fifth. These top five receive **51.01 per cent** of total 2024 inside GHO funding, corresponding to **\$1.53 billion**.
14. UN Agencies, Funds and Programs are the most funded in 2024 with **62.67 per cent** of all GHO funding received. The second most funded is International NGOs, standing at **25.07 per cent**. The Pooled Funds rank third, receiving **8.41 per cent** of total GHO funds. The share of local and national organizations (as per the Grand Bargain definition) stands at **1.58 per cent** by the end of March 2024.
