## Overview of Humanitarian Funding

**What Table 1 tells us** → The total humanitarian funding for 2025 is **\$120 million** more than what was recorded at this time last year for 2024. The 2025 GHO requirements of **\$45.78 billion** is the lowest in the last three years. Almost **50 per cent** of total humanitarian funding in 2025 went to the coordinated plans, with the remaining **50 per cent** going to humanitarian operations outside the coordinated effort. In March 2025, **89** funding reports were submitted by reporters to the FTS for processing. This included **34** reports for 2024, **41** reports for **2025** and **14** reports for multi-year funding ranging from 2023 to 2028.

**What Table 2 tells us** → The most funded sectors in 2025 are “multiple sectors – shared” with **\$953.04 million**, followed by food security, health, protection and multi-sector respectively. Food security has received the most funding over the last three years. However not included in the above table, funding reported without sectoral granularity (“not specified”) accounts for **19.30 per cent** of total 2025 funding (equivalent to **\$1.16 billion**). GBV received **1.02 per cent** of total funding in 2023, **1.26 percent** in 2024 and **2.0 per cent** in 2025.

**What Table 3 tells us** → The “Global” category is the most funded with **20.24 percent** of total funding, while ROSEA is the second most funded with **18.51 percent** in 2025 and ROMENA is the third with **15.47 per cent**. In 2024, the top three most funded regions, ROMENA, ROSEA and ROWCA, received **61.14 per cent** of total funding (**\$21.20 billion**). Likewise, these three regions also ranked among the top three in 2023, receiving **68.62 per cent** of total funding (**\$17.33 billion**).

**What Table 4 tells us** → As noted in the previous table, “Global” has received the most funding over the last three years, accounting for a fifth of total 2025 funding at the end of March. Ukraine, Sudan, Afghanistan, Sudan and multiple locations (shared) follow respectively in 2025. The OPT was the most funded in 2024 with **\$2.90 billion** or **8.38 per cent** of total funds. Ukraine took the lead in 2023 with **\$3.63 billion** (**9.83 per cent**).

**What Table 5 tells us** → The top three donors have remained the same for the past three years: USA, Germany and ECHO. The top five have provided **\$3.41 billion** (**56.68 per cent**) of the 2025 total humanitarian funding, **\$23.29 billion** (**67.19 per cent**) of 2024 funding and **\$23.34 billion** (**63.17 per cent**) of 2023 funding. USA, the top donor, provided **14.65 per cent** (**\$881.90 million**) of total humanitarian funding in the first three months of 2025. USA provided **40.87 per cent** of total 2024 funding by the end of March 2025 (**\$14.17 billion**).

**What Table 6 tells us** → The top five received **37.83 per cent** of total funding in 2025, equivalent to **\$2.27 billion**. In 2024, **55.35 per cent** of global humanitarian funding (**\$19.19 billion**) went to the top five recipients. The top five recipients in 2023 were the same as in 2024, receiving **51.55 per cent** of global humanitarian funding (**\$19.05 billion**).

**What Table 7 tells us** → National and local organizations received only **3.42 per cent (\$205.73 million)** of total humanitarian funding in 2025 and “International Government Entities” have **60.34 per cent** out of this total (**\$124.14 million**). UN Agencies received the most funding with **52.42 per cent** in 2025 , **61.00 per cent** in 2024 and **56.04 per cent** in 2023.

*What Table 8 tells us* → As of end of March 2025, **6.65 per cent** of the 2025 global appeal was funded with provision of **\$3.04 billion** noting that not all of the 43 plans were published. The 2024 GHO funding is **\$810.21 million** less than that of 2023. Likewise, requirements for 2024 are **\$6.61 billion** less when compared to 2023 requirements. *What Table 9 tells us* → Funding for HRPs increased by **\$403.66 million**, REGs by **\$142.45 million** and FAs by **\$61.77 million** in one month. On the contrary, funding towards other types of plans decreased by **\$0.42 million** (This mainly relates to the decrease in funding towards the “Bangladesh Cyclone Remal and Monsoon Floods Response Plan 2025” from **\$1.19 million** at the end February to **\$0.77 million** at the end of March.) The GHO ratio increased from **5.45 per cent** to **6.65 per cent** and requirements by **\$1.07 billion** in a month time.
