Overview of Humanitarian Funding

What Table 1 tells us → A three-year comparison demonstrates a decrease in 2023 and 2024 funding compared to 2022. However, reported 2024 funds show an increase of **\$476.53 million** compared to 2023 funds. The 2024 GHO requirements, the lowest of the last three years and funded at **37.35 per cent**, is **\$6.36 billion** less than by the end of October in 2023.

What Table 2 tells us → FTS processed **\$25.33 billion** for 2024 with **73.05 per cent** of total sum allocated to support coordinated plans against **\$49.54 billion** GHO requirements. The unmet requirements stand at **\$31.03 billion**.

What Table 3 tells us → “Food Security” remains in the first place across the last three years. A significant proportion of funds continue to be reported to FTS without sectoral granularity, a practice FTS is working with reporters to correct: **\$4.35 billion** for 2022, **\$3.76 billion** for 2023 and **\$2.54 billion** for 2024.

What Table 4 tells us → ROMENA has received the highest portion of funds in 2024 with **\$6.54 billion / 25.84 per cent** of total humanitarian funding as in 2022 and 2023 with **\$10.06 billion** and **\$10.40 billion** respectively. ROSEA ranks second for the last three years - **21.37 per cent** of 2024 total humanitarian funding going to that region. ROLAC is the least funded region capturing **4.80 per cent** of 2024 funds, **5.35 per cent** of 2023 funds and **4.36 per cent** of 2022 funds.

What Table 5 tells us → “Global”, while not a country, continues to appear as the highest funded in FTS in 2023 and 2024 (**\$2.46 billion / 9.74 per cent** of total 2024 funding alone). Unlike 2022 and 2023, OPT is the most funded country in 2024, and the “Escalation of Hostilities in the OPT Flash Appeal” has received **\$2.06 billion** of total funding going towards the country by the end of October 2024. Yemen is the second most funded country, Ukraine the third and Sudan the fifth in 2024.

What Table 6 tells us → The USA has remained the top donor for the last three years and provides **41.31 per cent** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024 (**\$10.46 billion**). ECHO, ranked third in both 2022 and 2023, has risen to the second place in 2024 with **\$2.26 billion** funding. Germany, which occupied the second place both in 2022 and 2023, has reported significantly less contributions in 2024 and dropped to third place. The top five donors have provided **65.46 per cent** of 2024 total funding. This ratio was **68 per cent** in 2022 and **63.71 per cent** in 2023.

What Table 7 tells us → The top five recipients have received **55.05 per cent** of total funds in 2024; i.e. **\$13.94 billion**. The WFP alone has received more than one fourth of the 2024 funding. Among the top five recipients of 2024 funding are UN Agencies as well as international NGOs reported confidential due to security considerations.

What Table 8 tells us → National and local organizations have received **4.43 per cent (\$1.12 billion)** of the total humanitarian funding in 2024. Among national and local organizations, National Governments have received the most funding with **2.90 per cent**, equal to **\$733.81 million**. UN Agencies are the most funded recipient in 2024 with **59.59 per cent** of total funds (**\$15.09 billion**). International NGOs with **\$5.81 billion (22.97 per cent)** are the second most funded in 2024.

What Table 9 tells us → **73 per cent** of the 2024 humanitarian funding (**\$18.50 billion**) has gone towards **48** coordinated plans consisting of **24** HRPs, **10** FAs, **9** RRP and **5** other types of plans. Outside GHO funding for 2024 stands at **27.00 per cent** with **\$6.82 billion**. This percentage is on par with previous years.

What Table 10 tells us → **24 HRPs** constitute **75.23 per cent** of 2024 total GHO funding (**\$13.92 billion**). This is followed by **10 FAs** with **13.17 per cent** (**\$2.43 billion**), **9 RRP** with **11.35 per cent** (**\$2.10 billion**) and **5 other types of plans** with **0.25 per cent** (**\$45.76 million**). Escalation of Hostilities in the OPT FA is the most funded plan of 2024 (**\$2.06 billion**), followed by Ukraine HRP (**\$1.81 billion**) and Sudan HRP (**\$1.52 billion**).

GHO funding has dwindled from **\$30.48 billion** to **\$25.12 billion** from 2022 to 2023, equaling to **17.56 per cent** drop in a year time. On the contrary, 2023 GHO requirements are **8.61 per cent** more than that of 2022.
